# TIMELY WITH MAJOR EU-JAPAN CULTURE & EDUCATION POLICY DEVELOPMENTS

These two ENCATC events are perfectly timely with the recent European policy development in culture and education. On 6 July 2018, **Tibor Navracsics**, European Commissioner for Education, Culture, Youth and Sport, and **Yoshimasa Hayashi**, Japan Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), met in Budapest to officially launch the **EU-Japan Policy dialogue on Education, Culture and Sport**.

The meeting was the occasion for Commissioner Navracsics and Minister Hayashi to launch **two new Japan-EU joint initiatives**:

**a joint call for proposals** to co-finance consortia of excellent European and Japanese universities



Both initiatives **emphasize the importance of people to people contacts within the EU-Japan relations**, especially within the framework of the Japan-EU Strategic Partnership Agreement (SPA) which is expected to be signed in the near future.
